# A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER NSW CRICKET UMPIRES & SCORERS ASSOCIATION

Season 10/11 saw a steady growth in membership numbers with a 2.5% increase. Over the past three years our membership has increased by 8.8%, 5.9% and 2.5% respectively.



Availability for the SCA Grade Panels was once again high at the beginning of the season but we experienced puzzling trends where several rounds saw us unable to provide umpires for some 5<sup>th</sup> grade matches. We had full availability for Green Shield, Poidevin Gray Shield where preference was given to those umpires who expressed availability for the entire competitions. First Grade Limited overs and Twenty20 competitions where 1<sup>st</sup> grade and Poidevin Gray Shield games were scheduled on the same day were handled by Panel 1 umpires only.

We were able to once again provide an overflow of umpires for appointment to the Sydney Shires Competition at irregular intervals. Most umpires accepted the appointments but unfortunately some still refuse to accept these opportunities. The Association is looking at making full availability to all SCA Competitions part of the requirement for selection on SCA Panels next season. In addition our development opportunities saw several of your members officiate in SCA Grade matches ranging from grades 1 to 3. These opportunities are important as part of our overall commitment to allow umpires to reach the highest level or at least the one they set as their goal.

Once again a strong platform of recruitment and development provided by Education and Development Manager Darren Goodger gave us a steady flow of new umpires some of whom chose to officiate in the Sydney Shires Competitions. It is pleasing that our service in assisting Affiliated bodies to grow proportionately still produces good results.

The Sydney Shires Cricket Umpires Association continues to recruit and provide umpires and it was significant that the goal of a "full book" of every match being covered marked an important part of your history - the 10th Anniversary Sydney Shires Cricket Umpires Association. A full complement of appointments was made during Shires Round 11 on Saturday February 5. Congratulations on this significant achievement which occurred using members solely from your own Association.

On the training and education front, we once again witnessed large numbers of people interested in undertaking the Laws Education Courses. We ran a course at the Cricket NSW facility at Blacktown Olympic Park and the numbers were excellent ensuring that the western areas of the Sydney metropolitan area receive access to our training classes. We will be back there again this winter along with our traditional course to be run at the Cricket NSW auditorium.

We congratulate Sydney Shires Cricket Umpires Association on another great season and join with you in celebrating the success of your 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. With best wishes.

# A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN SYDNEY SHIRES COMPETITION SUB COMMITTEE

It is a revelation and a cause of momentous celebrations witnessing the Shires Umpires Association attain its first 10 years of operation. It has been a short but exciting journey to date and I vividly remember the early beginnings how in September 2000 under the Chairmanship of Noel Laming, the SCA Management Committee



decided to allot umpires from grade panel 4 directly to 5<sup>th</sup> grade instead of 1<sup>St</sup> Grade Shires and the writing was on the wall. Do something urgently or else we would return to the bad old days of 1<sup>St</sup> Grade Shire players umpiring themselves as they had done from 1923 until 1988 with all of that unnecessary rancour and conflict which was so evident over the years.

Chairman Peter Daffen and I disagreed on the solution. He was in favour of allowing the situation correct itself in due course. On the other hand I had read that Sub Division Cricket in Adelaide had its own Umpires Association. Fortunately with a majority 10-4 vote of the Shire clubs at a hastily convened meeting at Airey Park in October 2000 saw the birth of your Association. Later that evening I rang my close friend Peter Turner to advise him what had happened and much to his surprise he was selected as your First President! Peter was onto the job the next day visiting NSWCU&SA Umpire Coordinator Peter Hughes who was a great supporter of the initiative and a list of retired and aspiring umpires including a relatively unknown Stephen Blomfield was secured. Shortly thereafter for the first time in Shires history we had our own umpires standing in our own games.... and so the baby was born!

Since those early days the fledging infant Shires Umpires Association has grown into a strong, vibrant and mature adult. Along the way it has had numerous doting and loving fathers including Presidents' Peter Turner, Bruce Parfett, George Richards, John Moore and now Peter Friend. Surrogate parents Stephen Blomfield, Gordon Smith, Trevor Schokman and Jim Shellens have been forever present watching over its growth. Despite some tantrums at the innumerable meetings by your robust committees and some quirky behaviour with the logo, numerous milestone coloured shirts and state of the art light meters, importantly it has resulted in an ever expanding number of umpires to your Association with many of your previous members attaining first grade status. Furthermore a lot of our 4th grade Shire games have regular umpires each weekend and now even the Grade Umpires ask your members to help them out in 5<sup>th</sup> grade. It is with a great deal of pleasure I present this my tenth Secretary's Report for this, the Sydney Shires Cricket Umpires Association – Season 2010/11.



Our tenth anniversary season has been a solid success. Membership numbers were slightly up, the numbers of umpires we put on the field has been on par compared to 2009/10 and overall we have certainly made a positive contribution to the Sydney Shires Competition. Our tenth anniversary round on 5 February saw us just scrape in with exactly 56 members willing to stand on the same day to see all 28 Shires matches receive 2 umpires each, a feat never ever before achieved in the history of the Shires competition. I was very proud of all the members that contributed on this day particularly when the weather on the day was a stinker, being the hottest day of the summer. It was interesting to note that in the 3 days leading into this round that NONE of our 56 appointees withdrew, knowing full well what the weather forecast was like for match day. On the other hand I heard that as many as 10 umpires withdrew from grade cricket in the 3 days leading into match day... tough stuff us Shires umpires are made of, someone was heard to say. I really want to thank all our members for not taking the easy option of pulling out just because the weather forecast on our anniversary round was not pleasant. You made for an inspiring day for the Shires competition.

Having now praised our 56 participating members on February 5, I turn my attention to the opposite side of the fence. My annoyance at the lack of commitment from around 20 or so other members who were inactive or umpiring outside of SCA competitions who refused to make themselves available for this one off historic event was extremely disappointing and made me question what reasons you have for actually holding membership with this Association.

Our 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary season started way back in July 2010 with the holding of the 9<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting at the Technology Park Hotel in Alexandria which was a new venue for us with the recent demise and closure of Redfern RSL. Sadly the new venue was not quite up to scratch and we continue to look for a suitable venue to hold our major meetings. A total of 36 (of 77) members attended the evening. Guests on the night were Graham Chudleigh and Darrell Hair representing our parent affiliate in NSWCU&SA. Important issues arising from the AGM were —

- Notification of Five New members joining the Association
- Match payments to increase to \$110 per day
- Advice of a number of initiatives and special giveaways for members contributing to the upcoming 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Season
- The voting in by the membership of a number of changes to the Association's constitution which clarified and tidied up out of date processes.
- Special note was made of outgoing Treasurer Gordon Smith who was stepping aside after 9 seasons in the role

During the meeting Peter Friend was re-elected unopposed as President of the Association. Similarly, Stephen Blomfield was re-elected unopposed for his 10<sup>th</sup> term as Honorary Secretary. Michael Wheeler replaced Gordon Smith as Treasurer and Jim Shellens retained the Vice President's position. Other committee members elected were Mark Hughes, Trevor Schokman, Stuart Wood and Chris Williams.


Leading into this 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary season your committee had worked really hard for the previous 18 months or so coming up with ideas on how best we might celebrate our first 10 years as an Association. A great deal of work behind the scenes took place to ensure we all had a few new things to use this season. All active members were supplied with

- A free green 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary polo shirt
- A free Association cap
- A personalised note book holder embossed with each members name and membership number as well as a Law 42 "cheat card" updated with the 2010 amendments to the laws of the game
- A 50% discount on the supply of a blue field shirt

Thanks are extended to Gordon Smith who did a lot of background work on ordering the green anniversary polo shirt and baseball caps and to Ian Bowman who was in charge of the anniversary note book and Law 42 cheat card.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

As at 3 April which represents the last playing date of the 2010/11 cricket season, we had taken on board a total of 19 new members this season. The total membership count at this time registered 87, an increase of 5 from the same time twelve months earlier. Of these 19 new members, 18 of them were new applications and a further 1 was a re-join. In the losses column a total of 14 members left us with 6 of these allowing their memberships to lapse and another 8 choosing to resign. Of those 14 members that left us the average number of games they umpired in the previous season was only 3 games per member, so we lost a decent number of members that weren't really contributing very much on field activity for the Association.



Of our current 87 members as at 3 April 2011, a total of 39 members managed to umpire in 10 matches or more in the main Saturday competition. This compared to a figure of 34 last season. This was a great result for us and one it would be good to see we can improve on again next season. On the flip slide, the number of members who committed to every one of the 14 rounds played in the Saturday competition this season actually went down from last season's count of 15 to only 11. I want to thank the 11 members who showed 100% commitment to the competition this season and urge other members to do the same in season 2011/12

Of our current 87 members, 16 were inactive from umpiring in SCA controlled matches this season – a disappointing increase of 5 from last season's tally of 11. Of the remaining 71 members who did partake in SCA officiated matches, 66 umpired in Shires either on a part or full time basis and a further 5 umpired Grade Cricket. Of those 5 that umpired in Grade cricket, 2 were able to umpire at least one shires match in 2010/11. The total number of members who therefore partook in at least one Shires match during the season of 2010/11 was 68 out of our total membership of 87 – This represents a percentage figure of 78%.

For the first time since 1994/95, and for only the second time ever, the Strathfield club has won the Dave Tribolet Club Championship Trophy finishing with a total of 1449 points. Runners up were Burwood Briars on 1325 points. The Club Championship was very keenly contested with 5 clubs breaking the 1000 points barrier this season. Other clubs in the top 5 were Warringah (1278 points), Nth West Sydney (1238 points) and last years winner, Auburn (1179 points).

Appointments to the finals series were once again hotly contested by the members. This season saw more members than in any previous season express an interest in being considered for a finals match. Even more pleasing was that a higher percentage of members this season received an overall average season captains mark that allowed them to be considered for an appointment. Congratulations are extended to Brett Tribolet for being appointed to his debut First Grade Final. In the process, Brett becomes only the 9<sup>th</sup> member of this Association to be appointed to the First Grade Final since inception in 2001/02. On the day he was partnered with Peter Mooney who was backing up from last season's top match. Both performed well in a game won by minor premiers, Strathfield. The only movement from last year's top 8 umpires was Peter Friend (who was unavailable on Grand Final day last season) coming back into the Second Grade Final at the expense of Brian Breakspear who umpired last season's Third Grade Final. Brian "missing out" this season due to him being unavailable for any of the finals series.

Congratulations are extended to SSCUA member Jim Shellens who was appointed to the annual Shires v Grade match which to everybody's delight returned to the SCG after last season being played at Blacktown Olympic Park. Jim has filed a separate report regarding this match and you can locate Jim's match description elsewhere in this annual report.

#### **AWARDS & MILESTONES**

The winner of the 2010/11 Umpire of the Year Award was **Brett Tribolet**. This is Brett's first time at winning this award and it was a very popular win particularly with the 1<sup>st</sup> grade captains, many who commented that Brett was the stand out umpire in 1<sup>st</sup> grade during the season. Brett's success is in no small part due to his experience as a player having played for many seasons in the Shires competition mostly in the top grade. Brett has only just passed 50 career matches with the Association so to win this award after only a few seasons is one that Brett should be very proud of. No doubt Brett now has the chance to cement his place within the Association as one of our leading umpires for many seasons to come.

The winner of the other two major awards this season were **Ian Bowman** claiming the Most Improved Umpire of the Year, and **Aaron Vella** who took out the Rookie Umpire of the Year.

lan had a really good season and was rewarded with a significant number of matches in First Grade for the first time since he joined us about 5 years ago. His season mark was comfortably above the Association average of 71% and his mark this season was the best in his time with the Association. Well done lan.

**Aaron** came to the Association straight out of playing last season and fitted in right from the outset. His marks supplied by the mainly Second and Third Grade captains he umpired were of a very high standard for a debut umpire. These achievements were rewarded when Aaron was given the opportunity to umpire his debut match in First Grade in the final preliminary round of the competition. Congratulations Aaron.

#### **UMPIRE ASSESSMENTS / TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT**

A new initiative this season saw team captains provide online assessments of all our umpires using the SCA "My Cricket" website - this system also being used by Sydney Grade Cricket. Whilst this proved successful in not having to compile marks manually saving many hours of administration work, there were integrity issues experienced due to captains not completing the reports and leaving the task to others in their clubs who didn't even play in the match. This then resulted in the overall value of some assessments being called into serious question. I'm not so sure how this issue can be rectified, it certainly needs the backing of the SCA to chase down the clubs that have been known to put a low priority on the assessment of the umpires and make them change their attitude to this issue. Hopefully this is something that can be looked more closely as we approach the start of the new season.

The introduction this season of an online SCA playing conditions quiz for all active members was generally considered a great success for the season and one which the committee is going to persevere with in season 2011/12. I think some members got a serious wake up call when they got their quiz results and it goes to show that no matter how experienced an umpire you are that if you don't know the relevant playing conditions then eventually you are going to come unstuck and muck up the result of a match sooner rather than later. Time for some members to actually READ the playing conditions handbook once in a while in season 2011/12!

#### **MEETINGS & SOCIAL ACTIVITIES**

The Association conducted its usual four members meetings during the season. These consisted of the Annual General Meeting in July 2010 held at the Technology Park Hotel in Alexandria (47% of members attended), the pre season meeting in September in the auditorium at Cricket NSW (66% of members attended), the December meeting at the Bowlers Club in the city (41% of members attended), and the February meeting again at the Bowlers Club where we had guest speaker Richard Chee Quee (39% of members attended). Again this season we "floated" around from venue to venue and in the end had to outlay some income hiring the meeting room at Bowlers Club in December and again in February. With a bit of luck we are hoping that we can settle down at a new venue during the 2011/12 season.

The 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner on Saturday night 30 April was a great success. About 45 members and about 15 of those member's wives attended a German cuisine feast at the Essen Restaurant at Broadway. The committee was delighted to be able to put this function with a substantial subsidy to all attendees to recognise and celebrate our 10 years of existence. Thanks to the members of the committee for pitching in and making this a great event. Hopefully we can all be around to do something similar again in the future... maybe our 15<sup>th</sup> Anniversary??

#### **SEASON ANALYSIS**


Following on from the opening comments in this report I wish to advise that in season 2010-11 the following umpire allocations were achieved –

- \* 100% umpire coverage of all days play in First Grade Shires
- \* 100% umpire coverage of all days play in Frank Gray Shield Matches
- \* 100% umpire coverage of all days play in Second Grade Shires
- \* 95% umpire coverage of all days play in Third Grade Shires
- \* 40% umpire coverage of all days play in Fourth Grade Shires

There were 685 days of cricket played during the season 583 of these days of play received umpire allocations

Total Completion Rate 85.11% (Last Season was 85.19%)





We more or less matched last seasons record high umpire participation rate of 85.19% coming in this season at an almost identical 85.11%. Of note is that we achieved last season's figures this season with a significant drop in assistance from surplus Grade panel umpires. This means more of our members umpired more cricket in 2010/11, a pleasing effort to say the least. The downturn of surplus grade umpires was quite disappointing given the numbers supplied to us in 2009/10 were so healthy. How we can have one season like 2009/10 where 134 allocations of surplus grade umpires can exist and only have a lowly 23 allocations this season is a serious question of concern. We hope in 2011/12 this drop off in numbers can be turned around so that more games of cricket that normally wouldn't have umpires can get officials for their games.




#### **SEASON ANALYSIS**

Last season I spoke about the "Magic Number" of 42 which was the number of umpires required to allocate all matches in First, Second and Third Grades with two standing officials. Last season we achieved this target in most rounds. This season we were hoping to better that number and look to give a decent number of Fourth Grade matches some umpires. Unfortunately numbers were about the same as last season. We did however fully subscribe Rounds 8 (only 28 umpires needed doing 2 x 20/20 matches in a day) as well as our  $10^{Th}$  Anniversary Round 11. In Round 10 we also covered all Fourth Grade games with 6 games getting umpires on both days and the seventh game in that grade seeing umpires only on day 1.

#### OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST

A Change of Uniform: After introducing the use of the blue field shirt to limitedover matches in the previous season the Executive Committee approved the use of the blue field shirt for all matches played in the Shires competitions during the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary season of 2010/11. This is now our permanent shirt colour for all matches and the reports from all the clubs and players was that they felt this to be a very positive move. As well as the use of the blue field shirt all members were asked to wear the green 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary polo shirt to and from their Saturday matches. Again, this resulted in a lot of positive feedback regarding how smart and uniform we all looked. This was one of the success stories of this season for our Association

**Umpire Development Matches:** During January and February in consultation with NSWCU&SA Executive Officer, Darrell Hair, a total of three members were given the opportunity to experience a game in Sydney Grade Cricket. Members Chris Taylor and Brett Tribolet stood in a First Grade match, with first year member Dean Martin getting a run in a Third Grade match. All members said they gained a lot of positives from the experience more so because they were umpiring in a different environment with somebody new at a venue not umpired at before. The experience that these development matches offer our members is valuable and assists members to improve their game. We hope in season 2011/12 that we can offer some more members this experience.



This was the third year of the mentoring programme. Two year (twins Geoff and Mike Wheeler) umpired in the Grand Finals at the end of last season, and again this season. This year, Stuart Wood, who graduated last season, just missed out on a Grand Final.



All up, we had 19 new members this season, 18 were new to the Association and another one (Alan Green) decided to come back out of retirement to join us again in our 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Season. Of the 18 members who were new to the SSCUA, Eleven took part in the mentoring programme with all but one of those joining us for the start of the season. Apart from phone calls and other day-to-day support, this year for the first time, we ran a special session in late September for all the new members who had not umpired before. However those who did attend, and those who attended a repeat session in January at Auburn, seemed to gain a lot from it. We will try a different timing next year.

My thanks to Mike Wheeler, Jeff McKinnon and Malcolm Ward for their help in these sessions.

We also continued to run the ever popular You are the Umpire mini-quizzes, which help everyone to sharpen their knowledge and think through some tricky situations in the comfort of their own homes.

The following new members joined our Association in the season of 2010/11.

**Aaron Vella** - Left behind his career as a wicket keeper at Auburn Cricket Club and put on the black and white at the start of this season. He umpires mainly in second and third grade obtaining consistently high marks from captains. He attended the skills session in December, stood for the first time in 1st Grade near the end of the season and also was assigned a Qualifying Final and Semi Final in 3rd Grade. A very promising first season.

**Andrew Steindler** – Andrew joined us on a part time basis after having had a number of seasons in Grade cricket in 2008 & 2009 umpiring in panel 4. This season Andrew umpired 7 matches in Shires and acquitted himself very well in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grades. 

I arrived at the SCG at 7:30 in order to be <u>really</u> sure to beat the Harbour Bridge crush, to find the car park turned into a building site and the attendants at the entrance saying that there was no match to be played today. I was pretty sure that my assignment to the annual Sydney Grade vs Shires match, the Chairman's Trophy, was no hallucination, though when on my way towards Venue Services that same attendant assured me that the match was indeed on, I must admit to some relief.

I left my gear outside the locked umpires' room in the Members Stand and headed for the Ground itself. The groundsman signalled that it was OK for me to walk around the boundary (and probably wondered why I'd even asked), and I completed 2 laps taking in the view of the beautiful, huge outfield and all those famous stands.

My partner, Tony Wilds from Grade 1<sup>st</sup> panel, arrived shortly afterwards, having driven, as he does every weekend, from Bathurst. Entering the umpires' room, we took in the two boards listing all the umpires who had stood in 1<sup>st</sup> class matches and test matches down the years. Darren Goodger (one of the names on those boards) also came by, and helped us out with some unusual details (such as):

- they will simply bring the covers out if rain is coming;
- you don't have to call for drinks, they will just arrive at the correct time; and
- the sightscreens are done by remote control, but you have to stand for them to be set every time they are moved.

We had expected the groundsman to be very protective of his precious square, but he was welcoming and friendly, having provided a second day pitch for our game. The surface was fast, with plenty of grass and just the slightest give. Brett Richardson, Shires captain, won the toss and elected to bat.

After photographs on the ground in front of the dressing rooms, I called 'Play' at 10 am by the clock on the tower of the Members Stand. The SCG is the only ground I have ever umpired where you get replays — the main scoreboard was off, and anyway there were no TV cameras, but every sound, whether the shouts of the players, my (frequent) calls of Wide, or even the tap, tap of the waiting striker, echoed crisply off the stands.

Shires started slowly. Both openers were out to soft dismissals and they were 2-34 in the 12<sup>th</sup> over. However, Richard Gallichan (Lane Cove) contributed to two significant partnerships, first with Max Squire (Burwood) and then Daniel Johnson (Auburn). Squire had the day's top score of 52 including two imperious sixes into the Ladies Stand but he was out two balls after posting his half century. Gallichan fell just short at 47. Those two batsmen scored just under half the runs for the entire innings. When Gallichan was adjudged LBW by Umpire Wilds, the score was 5-134.

Gavin Scott (Georges River) and Chris McPherson (Macquarie University) made it to double figures. Perhaps the highlight of the match occurred when Greg Denlow (Macquarie University) struck a blow to deep mid wicket that would have cleared any boundary in Shires only to have it caught spectacularly by Tim McKay (Hawkesbury) just keeping his feet inside the boundary.

After 50 overs Shires made 9 - 201, and we retired for lunch in the members dining hall where Stirling Hammon entertained us with a recap of the morning's play.

When they came out to bat, Grade immediately made the Shires total look inadequate. Shane Pargeter (South Sydney) took the first wicket ending an opening stand of 41 scored at about 4 an over. Brett Richardson (Lane Cove) took the ball himself after 10 and soon after he claimed the 2<sup>nd</sup> wicket with the score on 60.

By then the Grade Captain, Russell Gascoine (Campbelltown) had gathered some momentum and started thrashing the ball all around the ground. Though he did give two hot chances which Shires were unable to grasp, he quickly took the score to 135 before falling for 41 smartly caught behind to a snick off spinner Daniel Johnson (Auburn) which I remember mostly for being the only time I got to raise my finger all day. His partner, Chris Small (Bankstown) accumulated easily and quickly until he passed 50 at which point he retired.

Shires bowlers Gavin Scott (Georges River) and Guy Davies (Warringah) did snare one wicket apiece, while Greg Denlow (Macquarie University), Richard Gallichan (Lane Cove) and Sean Walsh (Strathfield) were unable to break through. Shires fielders found the ground no smaller than Grade had, with all players needing to relay their throws from the distant boundary on the far side.

As the result became inevitable a small band of supporters (out of total crowd of about 50), gathered from several of the Shires clubs, started good natured cat calls whenever I called a sundry — they obviously had much experience of abusing umpires, but, hey, it was my only chance to be heckled at the SCG so it's a happy memory.

Grade ran down the Shires score in the 46<sup>th</sup> over, though in truth they never looked troubled.

The day finished with drinks in the Members Bar. Stirling Hamman delivered a well received summary of the afternoon, and made presentations to the losing captain (Brett Richardson of Lane Cove), man of the Match (Tim Mackay of Hawkesbury), and the winning Grade team's captain Russell Gascoine (Campbelltown).

My thanks to scorer Ian Wright, who provided the scorebook précis to me so that this match summary could be provided for this annual report.

In the weeks leading up to the final, Sydney had experienced a deal of wet weather. However, the morning of 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2011 was a clear and sunny day. All participants arrived early to look over the excellent ground and accommodation facilities at Blacktown Olympic Park. The groundsman informed all that the pitch being used was the same one as used for the Shield game earlier in the season. It was relatively hard with an even cover of grass

Prior to the toss, the Shires Chairman, Stirling Hamman gave a typical "Stirling" speech to all of players in a centre field address. He congratulated both teams in making the final and wished them every success for the game. The toss took place on time and was won by Burwood who decided to have first bat.

The Burwood innings commenced steadily for the first 20 minutes until Ben Hurford lost his wicket to the fired up Ben Edmondson. This brought the leading Shires batsman and Burwood captain, Jason Holley to the crease. Although losing his partner, Andrew Jalalaty at the other end, Jason soon started to dominate the bowling with some powerful dives and appeared set for another big score, coming off his match-winning century the previous week in the semi-final against Lane Cove.

However, just as he appeared set, he played a soft lofted drive to the cover point fieldsman and was duly on his way back to the pavilion with a score of only 21. The Strathfield side, at this stage was quite ecstatic and then continued to bowl tightly whilst picking up the further wickets of Seymour and Squires.

After lunch, Burwood started a fight-back with Ben Chapman and Adrian Nelligan coming together at the crease. Adrian, in particular, being an ex-Strathfield player, was keen to match it with his former team mates. He managed to find the gaps and score some aggressive boundaries. Burwood had recovered quite well until Adrian was dismissed on a score of 30 and Ben top-scored with 31. Their partnership had accrued a valuable 54 runs but the lower order failed to capitalise and Burwood was finally dismissed for a score of 145 on day 1 just over 30 minutes before tea.

All Strathfield bowlers performed well. Garry Sheen was always likely to pick up a swag of wickets with his tight swing bowling and finished with 3/39 off 21 overs. Ben Edmondson made the early breakthrough, finishing with 3/49 off 17 overs whilst Mark Owens cleaned up the lower order with 3/6 off just 3.3 overs. Wicketkeeper, Ian Janda, assisted with 3 fine catches.

Between innings, the Strathfield captain elected to have the pitch rolled for the customary 7 minutes. Strathfield began their innings in a bright fashion but lost opening batsman, Pat Bolster before tea and Lee Ryanhart after tea. Garry Sheen and Damian Duroux joined forces in the middle but Duroux was out Ibw fairly early in his innings. Sheen batted very conservatively as if a Strathfield victory hung on his shoulders and when he was dismissed with a Strathfield score of only 4/59, it appeared to the Burwood players, at least, that Burwood was headed for premiership glory. However, they had not reckoned with an excellent fightback by firstly the middle order pairing of Andrew Donovan and Sean Walsh who put on a partnership of 102 runs and secondly, the pairing of Andrew Donovan and Ian Janda who put on a 7<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership of 67. Individually, Donovan top-scored for the match with 66 not out, Walsh scored 54 and Janda 43. The innings played by Walsh was a joy to watch and he was not far off being judged man of the match.

Strathfield batted well into day 2 and at the drinks break between lunch and tea, when Strathfield was 7/238 and in an unbeatable position, Burwood conceded defeat. Best bowlers for Burwood were Derek Welsh, 2/15 (off 9) and Sanjiv Khalkho 2/41 (off 18). Wicketkeeper, Andrew Jalalaty tried hard and took 4 good catches.

The Peter Toohey Man of the Final award was given to Andrew Donovan, Strathfield, for a vital 66 not out and holding his team's innings together whilst taking them to victory.

Michael Wood, Shires Deputy Chairman officiated at the after match formalities. He congratulated both teams for playing in good spirit. Congratulations were also extended to the winning team, Strathfield who are now 2010/11 premiers. The venue was an excellent choice and one to be strived for again in futures years.

Warringah toiled hard with the ball with plenty of chat and energy that never wore down at all as the day went on. At one stage Warringah may well have rescued their position having Burwood wobbling at 4/62..... Enter that man Ben Critchley, again.

A marvellous controlled innings of 56 not out enabled Burwood to take the opportunity of an outright victory away from Warringah seeing the day out to finish at 6/201 off 89 overs.

Warringah, for their part, never gave up and tried everything possible to break down the stubborn Burwood batting line up. For Warringah it was not to be, for Burwood, it was a well deserved victory.

For the umpires, there was an abundance of appeals throughout the match, yet the Spirit of Cricket won through. Mention must be made of the fact that with a first innings lead just 10 runs away Will Hood, the Burwood Captain refused to appeal for a very close catch in the slips and went on to instruct the umpires to give a decision of not out.

By the time lunch fell due the score had progressed to 9/109 with Warringah having it all to do while Macquarie Uni only needed one wicket.

Half an hour after lunch, Falconer was out caught, for Warringah to be all out for 130 off 79.3 overs in 253 minutes. The next partnership took the score to 85 with Lindfield skipper Steve Watts and Adam Rezek steadying the ship before Watts fell to a great one handed catch at backward point.

Cooper skied a catch to cover, Lomax was run out attempting a suicidal second run and then on the first ball of the 50<sup>th</sup> over the last pair took off for an impossible second run to a ball that was hit directly to the fielder on the cover boundary. The incoming throw was over the stumps and the 10<sup>th</sup> Lindfield wicket had fallen to another unnecessary run out and the premiership went to Warringah by a margin of only 7 runs.


