Simon Dodwell is the winner of the Shires' Umpire of the Year Award for season 2018–19



This becomes Simon's second consecutive season where he has won this award and comes on the back of a successful summer that saw Simon appointed to the two big games of the season—the First Grade Grand Final as well as the premiership decider in the Frank Gray Shield.

Simon joined the Association in 2016 and has just completed his third full season as a member of the SSCUA. In those three seasons he has umpired a total of 69 career matches, 41 of those being in First Grade. Simon is a very popular and respected umpire within the Shires community as well as the SSCUA membership. He has an excellent rapport with team captains and players, but will not hesitate to step in and be firm if a player chooses to step out of line.

Simon's captains' marks tallied up to an average score of 92.4 out of 100 with the overall Association average mark being 76.4 out of 100. His overall season mark of 92.4 is the second highest winning score in the Association's history falling short of the 92.6 mark that was set by Darren Goodger in 2011–12.

At season's end Simon's mark of 92.4 has narrowly beaten his nearest rival who finished the season on 92.2 out of 100, with third place tallying 86 out of 100

We congratulate Simon on an outstanding season in 2018–19 and look forward to seeing him contribute next season in a similar fashion.

# Our SSCUA President

At the conclusion of the 18th year of the Sydney Shires Cricket Umpires Association, I am pleased to say that our membership has continued to rise and is standing at 120, as at the end of the season, a record for the Association. Once again we managed 100% umpire coverage in all Shires fixtures. We also supplied one umpire to every game in the Tim Creer Cup and the Sunday Masters and Classics competitions.

When I wrote here last year, I drew attention to the new MCC 2017 Code which was adopted by the Sydney Cricket Association with effect from our 2017–18 season. Since then, some issues have emerged, and so MCC has produced a second edition, which came into force on 1st April 2019. The majority of these changes are simply minor corrections or clarifications, and will not make a material difference to us. We will be addressing these changes in our pre-season meeting in September.

## Finals

It was great to have eight of our new members, who only joined our ranks in the past two years, be awarded an appointment in the Shires Qualifying Finals. Two of these members, Daniel Izard and Warwick Vyse, only joined our ranks this season, but had sufficiently demonstrated their skills to be awarded a Finals Match. Our congratulations are extended to them, and particularly to our Grand Final Umpires and to those sides in the Grand Final matches in season 2018–19, where the Finals were sadly affected by the weather as was the case two years ago:

### 1st Grade

Simon Dodwell and Anthony Raymond. Mt Pritchard Southern Districts 8/170 drew with Warringah 6/208 (dec) at Joe McAleer Oval. No play occurred on Saturday due to a waterlogged outfield. A full day's play occurred on Sunday with Mt Pritchard Southern Districts taking the Premiership as they were the higher ranked team.

and Classics competitions. These competitions have proved to be a rich source for us to recruit to our umpiring ranks. Congratulations to the two competition winners: Masters - Auburn Cricket Club; Classics - Sri Lanka Lions Cricket Club.

## Spirit of Cricket

The Shires Spirit of Cricket Award is especially important to our umpires, being awarded as a result of the marks which we give teams after each match, across all the grades in our competition. There is no doubt that as umpires, there is much greater pleasure taken in our match experience when a team's performance is conducted within the Spirit of Cricket. Sadly, that is not always the case in Shires Cricket and as a huge advocate of the Spirit of Cricket, I am personally disappointed that our Association's members were faced with 25 instances of poor behaviour that led to Code of Conduct reporting.

Indeed, Shires players contributed 46.3% of all offences in the SCA, yet the Shires competition plays just 29.6% of all matches! I would like to thank the SCA Code of Conduct Commissioner, John McGruther and his team, for supporting our members after they lodge a report.

However, it is with special pleasure that I am able to recognise the playing of cricket within the Spirit of the Game and congratulate North West Sydney Cricket Club as the recipient of this award for 2018–19. The Club had the highest Spirit of Cricket Score of any Club since the current scoring system commenced in 2010. I also wish to recognise the individual Grade winners: Roseville (1st Grade); North West Sydney (2nd Grade and Frank Gray); Pennant Hills (3rd Grade); Lane Cove (4th Grade).

As always, I am indebted to and would like to thank all our Executive Committee, who have met regularly over the course of the season, giving freely of their time, supporting Shires Cricket and taking into account the needs of our Association's membership. It has made my job as President that much easier having such a strong and committed group to work with. Our tireless Secretary, Stephen Blomfield, and our Treasurer, Trevor Schokman, in particular, have done much to ensure our meetings are both relevant, informative and productive.

Stephen remains the driving force behind the Association and ensures that





our appointments are filled satisfactorily and statistics maintained. He presents and circulates playing conditions and ensures results and reporting are completed correctly. His passion for Shires Cricket and for our Association is our core and foundation. Thank you. I would also like to mention, Life Member, Ian Bowman who produces this fabulous and enviable Annual Report, and Stephen Murphy who maintains our excellent web-site.

# Our SSCUA Secretary

It is with much pleasure that I present this my eighteenth Secretary's Report for this, the Sydney Shires Cricket Umpires Association - Season 2018-19.

## Another Season and More Broken Records

Another year has come and gone and it seems they go past faster and faster as each season comes and goes. The 18th season of the SSCUA was another successful one with membership numbers at an all time high and total matches covered by our members also at record numbers. Despite all that we still have further room for growth and it will be an interesting off season as we look to recruit new members into our competition. The task of finding new members is one that falls to each and every one of you and should not be left in the hands of a chosen few. Your continued support of our Association is always appreciated by your Committee and I hope that many of you can identify somebody that might like to take up the challenge of umpiring with the SSCUA. The below report is a summary of season 2018-19.

## The SSCUA 17th Annual General Meeting

As is now custom, the first meeting of the 2018-19 season was the holding of the Association's 17th Annual General Meeting on the first Wednesday of August, that date this year being 1 August 2018. A total of 46 members (out of a total membership of 112 at the time) attended on the evening. Guests on the night were Laurie Borg who represented the board of directors for NSWCUA. Also in attendance were Troy Penman and Nic Bills who run the administration side of things at Cricket NSW for NSWCUA. John Biviano the Chairman of the Shires Competition Sub Committee rounded out the guests at this meeting.

Stephen Blomfield (Secretary) and Trevor Schokman (Treasurer) were re-elected unopposed for their 18th and 5th terms respectively. David Goodman was re-elected unopposed for his Third term as Association President with Stephen Clements being re-elected unopposed as the Vice President.

Ken Buckland, Rick Crocono, Cameron Duff, Glen Hanshaw and Patrick Smellie

were re-elected onto the management committee which meant no changes from the previous 2017-18 season were required. The total number elected to the Executive Committee was once again a total of nine, the maximum number allowable under the Constitution.

Laurie Borg, Troy Penman and John Biviano all spoke to the meeting about their various roles and provided updates to the membership on issues that

were relevant to the upcoming season.

## Masters And Classics Cricket

Season 2018-19 was the seventh consecutive summer where we supplied umpires to the Masters and Classics competitions. The season itself saw us comfortably appoint

an umpire to all matches across the 22 weekends these competitions were played. This is a significant achievement particularly on certain Sundays where we also had to appoint umpires to Frank Gray Shield and/or Tim Creer Cup.

Two highlights occurred during the season that need to be reported on. Firstly, the Association in November appointed an umpire to its 1,000th Masters/Classics match and then around the same time member Spencer Harrison umpired his 100th match in these competitions. Spencer's commitment to the Masters and Classics competitions is well known and he is genuinely appreciated by the players who partake in these competitions.

Another pleasing aspect to the season was the increased number of members that accepted appointments in these competitions. A total of 45 members umpired at least one match which is an increase of five compared to the 40 members who were involved in the previous season. Thank you to all members who made a contribution. Your participation is very much appreciated by your Executive Committee as well as the clubs and players across Masters and Classics cricket.

Congratulations to Saurabh Ganguly on winning the umpire of the year in these competitions during the season. Saurabh who was new to the SSCUA in 2018-19 impressed the team captains who marked him highly in each of the six Masters/Classics matches he

Umpire match fees for Masters and Classics games were increased from \$150 to \$160 this season which saw each team having to pay half of the required fee to the umpire on match day. This new amount has been locked in for two seasons and will be reviewed at the end of the 2019-20 season. Thanks are extended to the competition committee, lead by Stirling Hamman, for allowing this increase that sees match payments to this competition remain competitive with other Sunday appointment options that are out there. I strongly urge those who have yet to umpire one of these matches to give it a go. The environment these matches is played in is excellent, the players genuinely appreciate the umpires and you have a good day out while collecting a very healthy cash match payment.

The Masters/Classics committee once again approved a grant to our Association in the amount of \$2,400 which represents a \$75 levy on each of the 32 teams that played across both competitions during the season. This grant compensates our Association with the large amount of administration time that is spent on organising umpires for these competitions. Thanks are extended to the Masters/Classics management committee led by Stirling Hamman for making funds available to us.

The Masters Competition for players over the age of 40 went ahead with 16 teams this season - the same number as the previous season. With one round to go, the competition committee invoked a Playing Condition that saw the two highest placed teams on the ladder as at the end of Round 10 play off against each other in the final round. This set up a quasi Grand Final between Auburn who was undefeated and Warringah (one loss) with the game having two umpires appointed. In that match Auburn batted first and scored an imposing 6 for 220 off their 40 overs. Warringah, in pursuit, started slowly with the required run rate climbing very quickly. By the time Warringah tried to accelerate it was all a bit too late and wickets fell regularly to see them bowled out for 132 off 34.4 overs. And so for the second season in a row the Auburn club claimed the Masters Cricket

Premiership finishing on 436 points which was exactly the same number of points they acquired in the previous season. Warringah's loss in round 11 saw them drop back to third position with Macquarie Uni overtaking them to finish second on 368 points with Warringah finishing on 361 points. Further back on 315 points in 4th place was Georges River.

The Classics Competition for players over the age of 50 was played by 16 teams which was unchanged from the previous season. Throughout the preliminary rounds the two leading clubs were Sri Lanka Lions (defending premiers) and Warringah. In fact Sri Lanka went through the first ten rounds undefeated and Warringah only lost one game to Lane Cove. The final round saw these two clubs drawn to play each other, which would have seen the winner of that game claim the premiership. However mother nature saw to it on Sunday March 17 that no play was possible due to heavy rain washing out all cricket in Sydney that day. This saw Sri Lanka Lions go back to back winning the premiership with a final points tally of 388 to Warringah's 370. In third and fourth place were Georges River (314 points) and Lane Cove (312 points).

We look forward to this Association's continued involvement in these mature aged competitions. It really is important that those continuing to play, well past the average age that most quit the game, should be afforded the same rights that any other competition sometimes takes for granted. That, of course, is the supply of neutral match officials to oversee these fixtures.

### **Tim Creer Cup**

One of the most exciting innovations for the season was the Sydney Cricket Association taking over the running of the Tim Creer Cup and making it compulsory for all matches to be appointed an umpire. This was a massive improvement on the previous season where some clubs were willing to pay for umpire services and others were not. That 2017–18 season was somewhat problematic, with only some games having match officials, and this caused a number of issues that were not evident in season 2018–19, with all games being treated equally, with the allocation of a match official.

The manner in which the competition was managed opened up significant opportunities for our members with more match appointments available throughout the season. Generally speaking about 80% of the games were played on Sundays with the remainder on Saturdays. The average number of games each weekend started out at 11 but dropped to 10 after one team withdrew from the competition at Christmas time. These extra opportunities gave more of our members a chance to pick up an extra \$150 each weekend with each club in each match having to pay 50% of the umpire fee on the day of the game. I know many of our members who enjoy umpiring on both days each weekend were thankful for the fact that we had more opportunities to allocate around the membership.

During the season a total of 43 members participated in at least one Tim Creer Cup preliminary round match, most of these being Sunday appointments. I am really pleased with this number as it shows the membership really got behind the competition during the season and that everybody was willing to share the workload. Captain's assessment feedback was also excellent with the average score across a total of 389 assessments coming in at a very healthy 81.4%. Let's hope we can maintain such high standards in the season to come.

I am hopeful that those members who did not put up their hand this season consider nominating for a Tim Creer Cup appointment in season 2019–20. The more members available will mean that it is easier on me with the appointments and I am not forever scratching around to fill all the games with an umpire. The more games we all agree to umpire adds to your experience and will no doubt allow you to improve your umpiring skills.

At the completion of the 22 one day rounds of the Tim Creer Cup the competition went into finals series where the Sydney Cricket Association sought the services of two umpires per game instead of one, and also covered the cost of the umpire appointments rather than the clubs having to pay. My thanks to Sean Mantle, competition manager, as well as Bruce Whitehouse, Secretary of the Sydney Cricket Association, for their support of the Tim Creer Cup as well as the funding in their budget to pay for the umpires in the finals series. Our members greatly appreciated the work

and support received from both Sean and Bruce.

The Tim Creer Cup "A" division competition Grand Final saw Balmain South Sydney drawn to play Strathfield at Alan Davidson Oval on Saturday 30 March 2019. Umpires appointed were Les Chegvidden and Peter Mooney. Unfortunately the weather leading into the weekend was not kind. Further to this, the selected venue has a long history of draining poorly and on arrival at the ground it was pretty clear to everybody that play was not going to happen with a large amount of the outfield completely under water. In this competition a no result means joint premiers and so both clubs had to share the title.

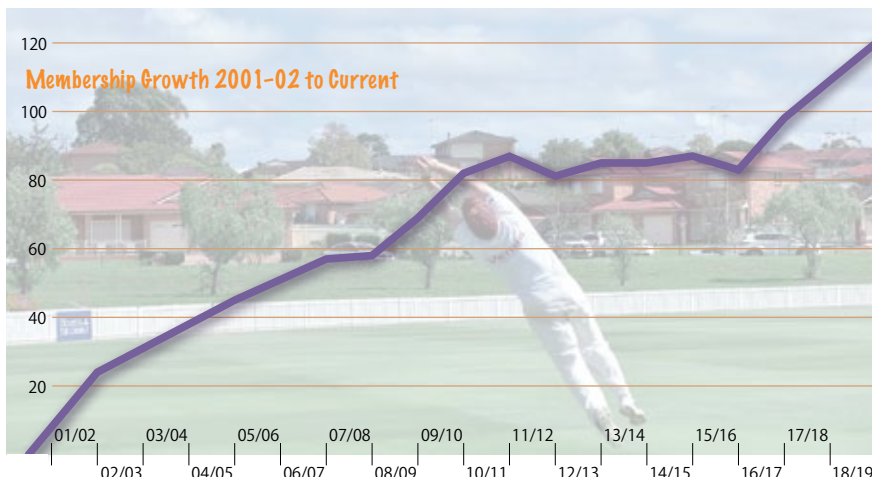
The Tim Creer Cup "B" division competition Grand Final saw Balmain South Sydney drawn to play Macquarie University at Jubilee Oval on Saturday 30 March 2019. Umpires appointed were Cameron McGinn and Scott Pryde. As was the case in the "A" division, rain mid week played its part, ensuring an on time start was not possible with surface water on the outfield being the main issue. Lots of hard work to mop up saw the umpires happy to start at 3.05pm for a match that would be reduced to just 25 overs a side. In a nail biting affair Balmain South Sydney batting first were bowled out in 23 overs for 105 but managed to hold off Macquarie Uni who finished 7 for 97 off their 25 overs – a close 8 run win for the home side.

As an Association we should look forward in season 2019–20 to once again getting behind the Tim Creer Cup. Your availability for this competition during the season will be greatly appreciated.

### **Membership**

As at 31 March 2019 which represents the last playing date of the 2018–19 cricket season, we had taken on board a total of 16 new members. The total membership count at this time registered 120 which is an increase of 11 from the same date twelve months earlier. The current membership tally of 120 sees the Association with the highest number of members that we have ever had at any point in time. Our continued growth is extremely pleasing but should not be taken for granted. All members need to continue to strive to spot opportunities to bring in new blood to ensure the Association continues to grow. As many of our experienced members are now aging, it is inevitable





that some of these long time trusted members are going to eventually retire from officiating. Therefore it is vitally important that we continue to seek out new members to become the next generation of umpires that will take us into the next decade and beyond.

In the losses column a total of five members left us with three resigning their memberships and the other two allowing their membership to lapse beyond the 31 August 2018 deadline to pay one's annual membership renewal fee.

The above graph shows total number of members each season since the inception of this Association back in 2001-02.

Of our current 120 members, as at 31 March 2019, a total of 39 members managed to umpire in 10 matches or more in the main Saturday competition during the 13 preliminary rounds. This compared to a figure of 30 last season. This is a great improvement on last season and this upward trend was one of the main reasons that we were able to appoint our own members to a higher percentage of matches this season. My thanks are extended to those members that made a commitment to umpire the majority of rounds in 2018-19 - your willingness to participate is always greatly appreciated.

Of our current 120 members, 30 were inactive from umpiring in SCA controlled matches this season, an increase of six

compared to season 2017-18. Of the remaining 90 members who did partake in SCA controlled matches, 58 devoted full time umpiring to Shires Cricket on Saturdays, an increase of seven compared to 51 the season before. A further 18 umpired between one and six Shires matches during the season (these classified as part time members) and the remaining 14 devoted themselves as full time umpires in Sydney Premier Cricket.

The Spirit of Cricket Award was won by the North West Sydney Cricket Club for the first time in the 16 seasons that this award has existed since its introduction in season 2003-04. North West Sydney had a comfortable win averaging 7.821 out of 10 across all four grades plus Frank Gray Shield with a margin of 0.235 to its nearest rival which was Roseville Cricket Club who finished with an overall average of 7.586. The scoring system saw a range of 1.397 between first and last place on the Spirit of Cricket table with Auburn Cricket Club finishing at the bottom of the table with a club score of 6.424. The average score across all 14 participating clubs was 7.193.



Auburn's George Parry Oval won the Ground of the Year for the first time since 2006-07 collecting a season average mark of 8.04 out of 10. Runners up in this award were Burwood's Rothwell Park (7.99), Georges River's Bexley Oval (7.88) and then there was a significant gap to 4th place with North West Sydney's Kanebridge Oval finishing with a mark of 6.56. Unlike the Spirit of Cricket Award, the gap between first and last for the Ground of the Year was again quite significant with the home ground of Mount Pritchard Southern Districts Cricket Club (Greenway Park)

not having a good season and finishing at the bottom of the table with a low assessment mark of just 4.70 out of 10.

Congratulations are extended to the Burwood Briars Cricket Club on winning the Dave Tribolet Club Championship Trophy for the seventh season in succession finishing on a total of 1,176 points. In a close run race they won the Club Championship with a 67 point buffer to second placed Auburn who finished on a commendable 1,109 points. Warringah Cricket Club finished Third on 1,088 points and Fourth place was taken out by the George's River Club finishing on 1,082 points.

The average score for the season was 731.1 and the lowest scoring club was Balmain South Sydney who finished the season on just 121 points.

The Executive Committee met on 6 March 2019 to debate and choose umpires for this season's finals series including the allocations to the Grand Finals. As was the case in the previous season the number of members expressing an interest to be selected for a finals series was quite high and this shows that more of our members than ever before are keen to be involved in the "pointy end" of the season.

The knock on effect of such a high number of interested members is that not everybody was going to be selected for a Qualifying Final. Tough decisions had to be made by the selection committee and the meeting on 6 March 2019 certainly proved to be just that with a vigorous discussion lasting a little over two hours seeing the committee settle on the appointments for the finals matches. At that selection meeting the committee identified as many as 16 members who were strongly in contention for a Grand Final appointment with only 12 positions available. There were a number of very close 50-50 calls where the selection committee used the results of the SCA Playing Conditions quiz that was distributed to members post Christmas to split one member from another. Special mention to Cameron Duff and Tim Overland (3rd Grade), Les Chegwidan (Tim Creer Cup Division A) and Cameron McGinn (Tim Creer Cup Division B) who were all selected for their first Grand Final appointments. Strong competition between our members for Grand Final appointments is a good thing as it can only improve the standard of our umpiring.

### Awards & Milestones

The winners of the four major awards for season 2018–19 were Simon Dodwell who won the Umpire of the Year Award for the second consecutive season, Michael Conway who won the Most Improved Umpire of the Year Award, Vin Sharkey who took out the Rookie Umpire of the Year Award, and Saurabh Ganguly who wins the Umpire of the Year (Masters & Classics Cricket) award. All four winners will be presented their respective perpetual trophies at our Annual General Meeting to be held at Club Redfern on Wednesday 7 August 2019. A full report on each member and the award they won is detailed more towards the front section of this Annual Report document (see pages 4 and 5).

During the course of the season a number of members passed significant milestones which were acknowledged with the awarding of each members respective career games polo shirt. Congratulations are extended to all of the below listed members on reaching these achievements –

Further congratulations are extended to the five members this season that made their debut in Shires First Grade. Congratulations to Grahame Bell, Cameron Duff, John Kirkness, Cameron McGinn and Scott Pryde who all were appointed by the SSCUA to their debut matches in Shires First Grade in the early part of the season. All were presented with a medallion commemorating these achievements at Association meetings during the season. We look forward to seeing these members continued presence in our top grade next season making positive contributions to Shires Cricket.

### Umpire Assessments

The ninth season of the online umpire assessment facility provided via the "My Cricket" website once again gave the Association a quick and easy method to

track the progress of our members according to the team captains. The Executive Committee conducted a meeting on 6 March 2019 to select finals series umpires and it was once again noted that the nominal pecking

order for the umpire appointments to the Shires finals series as suggested by the majority of the Executive Committee was very close to the ranking of our members by the team captains. A percentage of our members don't always believe in the captain's assessment criteria. My comment to those members is this - Yes, one captain's mark standing alone does not equate to anything of significance. But when you add up and average out a large number of assessments across the majority of the season then you have a strong and reliable source of data that tells you how an umpire is performing. Your committee has great faith in this system





and will continue using this as one of our trusted methods to track the progress of our umpires.

Of the reports received this season, a total of 1,677 umpire assessments were captured in the "My Cricket" system across a total of 131 people who officiated in at least one Shires match this season. A total of 85 of those 131 were SSCUA members and the balance were NSWCUA members from Premier Cricket who assisted us during the season.

The average captains assessment mark of all umpires in Shires Cricket this season came in at 76.4 out of 100 representing an increase of 0.4 compared to last season's average of 76.0 out of 100. Each season for quite a few years now I am continually pleased to report that the Association's average mark is going up as follows -

2013-14 = 73.4%

2014-15 = 73.4%

2015-16 = 74.6%

2016-17 = 75.2%

2017-18 = 76.0%

2018-19 = 76.4%

The numbers here do not lie. We as an Association continue to improve year after year. This is particularly pleasing for your

Executive committee who spend many hours at our meetings looking for ways to improve the standard of umpiring for the Shires competition. I look forward to another small increase in the overall percentage mark in season 2019-20.

## Player Behaviour / Code Of Conduct

In total, there were 25 Code of Conduct Reports in Shires cricket this season which was an increase of three from last season. As well as the 25 reports in Shires Cricket there were also an additional 29 reports in Premier Cricket bringing the total number of reports in SCA Cricket to 54 - a drop of 23 compared to season 2017-18.

The Association wishes to offer our thanks to the Code of Conduct

Commissioner John McGruther and his assistants for the work they did in season 2018-19. John and his team provide the required support for our members when a Judiciary hearing has to be held and ensure our members are treated with respect at such hearings.

Thanks are also extended to those members during the season that supported the Code of Conduct and did not let matters of poor behaviour go unchecked. It is important to nip such issues in the bud when they happen because if you let it go then the player thinks it is okay, and then continues to behave the same way in future matches. This then causes stress for your fellow SSCUA colleagues that have to deal with such issues later in the season.

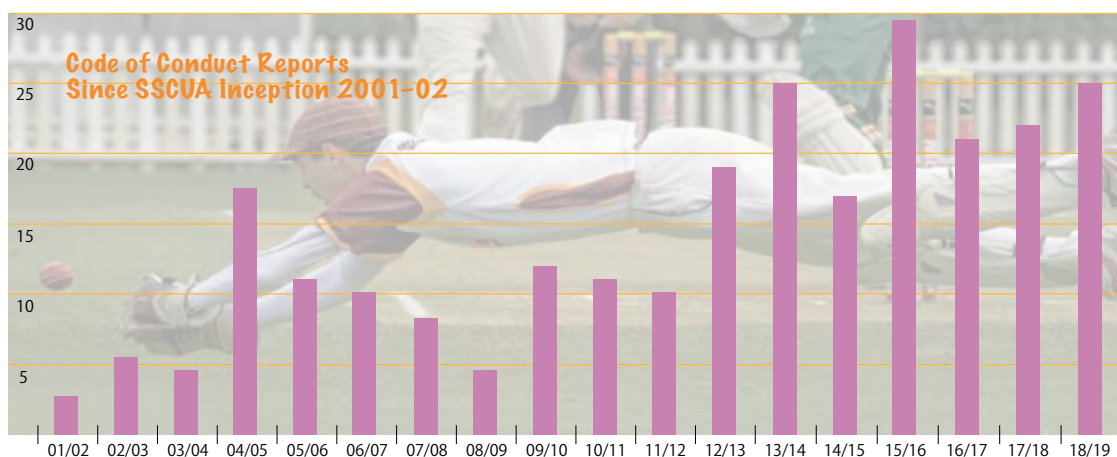
One interesting point to come out of the 2018-19 season was the significant

## Season Analysis

Season 2018-19 once again saw the SSCUA members in conjunction with our support network from Premier Cricket manage to achieve 100% umpire coverage in all matches across all grades. It's now been five seasons in a row with 100% coverage and you can effectively call it six in a row if you want to count the 98% coverage in season 2013-14.

For those not aware, umpire coverage prior to season 2013-14 was in the low 80% range which effectively meant no umpires at all being allocated to our fourth grade competition. We owe much



decrease in reports in Premier Cricket. Without a doubt this can be attributed to the outstanding work Darren Goodger did holding a number of pre season forums with most of the clubs that play in Premier Cricket. In those forums discussion took place as to how those stakeholders could improve in the areas of Spirit Of Cricket as well as unsatisfactory player behaviour.

The results speak for themselves with a 47% reduction in reports in Premier Cricket last season. Darren has kindly agreed to offer a similar workshop for Shires clubs in the coming pre season which, if implement, should no doubt go a long way to improving player behaviour in the Shires Competition.

Further to this, Darren has offered to do a learning and development workshop for the SSCUA in the pre season period to assist our members improve their skills in the way they deal with difficult on field situations. This forum has the backing of your Executive and we would hope all SSCUA members get behind

appreciation to our colleagues from Premier Cricket who willingly agree to stand in Shires Cricket to assist us in ensuring that all 28 Shires matches each Saturday are allocated two umpires in every game of every round.

I spoke in this report 12 months ago about the fact that in season 2017-18 a total of 77.6% of appointments in the preliminary rounds of Shires Saturday cricket were filled by our members with the remaining 22.4% being covered by our support network from Premier Cricket. I then went on to say how pleased I would be if we could improve our coverage to above 80% thus reducing our need to be calling upon non SSCUA members so often. In what could only be described as a major success of the season I am pleased to report that 88.6% of preliminary round matches on Saturdays were covered by members of this Association.

This is an outstanding achievement which is best summarised by our growing membership as well as an

apparent willingness of our members to be making themselves available for appointments on Saturdays more often than may have been the case in recent seasons. We should always be striving for better results so it would be outstanding if we could go past the 90% barrier next season.

During the season our best served round of cricket occurred right at the start of the season in round 1 where 54 of the available 56 spots were covered by SSCUA members. Our least served round occurred in February during the two day match in round 10 where 43.5 of 56 appointments were covered by our members.

Across the 13 rounds the average number of SSCUA members appointed to Shires Saturday cricket was 49.7 out of 56 per playing day, a significant increase on past seasons.

At this point I wish to acknowledge the outstanding support that we receive from NSWCUA with Darren Goodger and his team from the umpires department at Cricket NSW continuing to support us by providing surplus umpires from Premier Cricket to ensure that every Shires match in every grade is supplied with two umpires. Without that support 100% coverage would not be possible.

As stated above, members of this Association covered 88.6% of appointments during the 13 preliminary rounds of the season. The remaining 11.4% was covered by fellow members of the NSWCUA who chose Premier Cricket as their preferred competition to umpire in. The 11.4% coverage is also summarised in the following table. This table shows the statistics of how many umpires from Premier Cricket stood in a day of cricket in the Shires

Competition during 2018–19 as opposed to the previous 17 seasons. This season's number of 129 shows a sharp decline in the number of non SSCUA members who stood in Shires Cricket - this decline due to the record number of available SSCUA members seeking appointments on Saturdays during the 2018–19 season.

### In Other News...

#### Umpire Field Shirts

Season 2018–19 was a new era in regards to the field shirt we wore while officiating on the park. The two year sponsorship deal with "Beastwear" had ended in season 2017–18 and it was time for a new deal to be struck. Troy Penman, administration manager at NSWCUA, did a great job in brokering a new deal that saw our field shirts for seasons 2018–19 and 2019–20 carry sponsorship from Beastwear, the shirt manufacturer, as well as McDonalds restaurants.

The deal saw every member able to purchase two field shirts at a heavily discounted price of just \$10 each. I am sure I speak for all members in thanking Troy for all the hard work he did in establishing this deal for all members.

#### Umpire Match Payments

Umpire match fees for Shires cricket were once again increased more or less along the lines of inflation. Saturday competition preliminary round matches saw the daily umpire fee increased from \$137 to \$140, while the match fee for Sunday Frank Gray Shield limited over games, as well as Shires Competition finals series matches, saw no change with the fee being maintained at \$150.

Thanks are extended to the SCA for agreeing to the increases for Saturday round matches which are required to ensure we keep our umpires within the SCA family. Keeping the match fee competitive goes a long way to ensuring non SCA competitions don't have the opportunity to entice our members to consider umpiring elsewhere in the game.

#### Fund Raising Raffle

The Association once again conducted a fund raising raffle sponsored by Cricket Australia that saw two new cars listed as the first and second prizes.

My thanks to all members that supported the raffle, with some members choosing to purchase or sell half a book raising \$25, or a whole book raising \$50. The Treasurer in his pre season budget allowed for an amount of \$2,000 to be raised from the proceeds of this raffle. It is therefore extremely pleasing to report that the total raised was \$3,350—an increase of \$875 on the amount of \$2,475 raised in the 2017–18 season. Our increased membership was

clearly one of the main reasons for the increased revenue with a total of 69, out of 120, members supporting this fund raising initiative.

Special mention must be made of a number of members who went above and beyond expectation and offered to sell more than one book of tickets. Thanks of the Association is extended to Dennis Oppenheim (9 books), Craig Lees (3 books) and Grahame Bell, Stephen Clements, Keith Elloy, Clay Finnemore, Jude Fonseka, Ivan Holland and Trevor Schokman who all sold two books each. The funds raised from this raffle greatly assist the Association with its day to day operations and all members who made a contribution by selling tickets are thanked for their efforts.

A total of 51 members chose not to support this initiative which was a little disappointing—imagine how much we could raise if everybody chipped in and did their share. For those that chose not to make a contribution I ask that you please reconsider next season.

### **SSCUA Polo Shirts**

One of the new things provided to our members this season was a refresh of our image in the way of a change of polo shirt. The pale green SSCUA polo had served the Association well for the last seven years but feedback received in recent times saw your Executive implement a change.

The new aqua colour polo matches the polo worn by our colleagues in Premier Cricket. The feedback from the members this season was that the new polo was a marked improvement on the green polo with the fabric of the aqua polo deemed to be superior to the green polo.

The cost of the total purchase was funded via a \$10 per member co-payment as well as using funds supplied to the SSCUA via a recently received government grant. After the full expenditure of the grant there was still a small shortfall for the total order which was funded via surplus funds in the general account.

The Association purchased a polo for all active members and has adequate supply on hand to meet our needs for at least the next 2-3 seasons. Your committee was very pleased with this new item of uniform and we look forward to providing another free giveaway in season 2019–20 which will be fully paid for via another government grant that was successfully funded to the SSCUA in June 2019.

### **SSCUA Member Meetings**

Season 2018–19 saw the Association conduct four meetings. The scheduled fifth meeting (in November) was cancelled due to it conflicting with a mature aged mid week national carnival in the Penrith area that many of our members were involved with. We intend to resume the November meeting again in season 2019–20.

Our first meeting of the season was the Annual General Meeting on 7 August 2018 where 46 members attended. The pre season meeting in September was our best attended gathering with an all time record high 70 members attending on the night. Our Christmas meeting in December saw SSCUA member and NSWCUA Executive Officer Darren Goodger provide a very informative presentation to the 51 members who attended.

To finish off the season we were delighted to have Claire Polosak speak at our meeting in February. Claire is one of the leading female umpires on the planet and she spoke positively to the 44 members in attendance about her experiences umpiring at the upper level of the game as well as providing some great information about field craft.

I made an effort during the season to try and send different umpires each round to allow Margaret to get pictures of as many members as possible during the season.

This process went quite well with what I believe is a larger number of members photos appearing in this annual report. Amazingly a total of 80 members appear in at least one photo in this years report. Thanks for your help Margaret, the members appreciate your assistance.

To Ben Churcher from the Georges River Club I offer my thanks as well. Ben takes pictures at his club matches but was also available to take pictures at the Frank Gray Shield Grand Final, as well as the Shires 1st and 2nd Grade deciders. Thank you Ben for your support of the SSCUA.

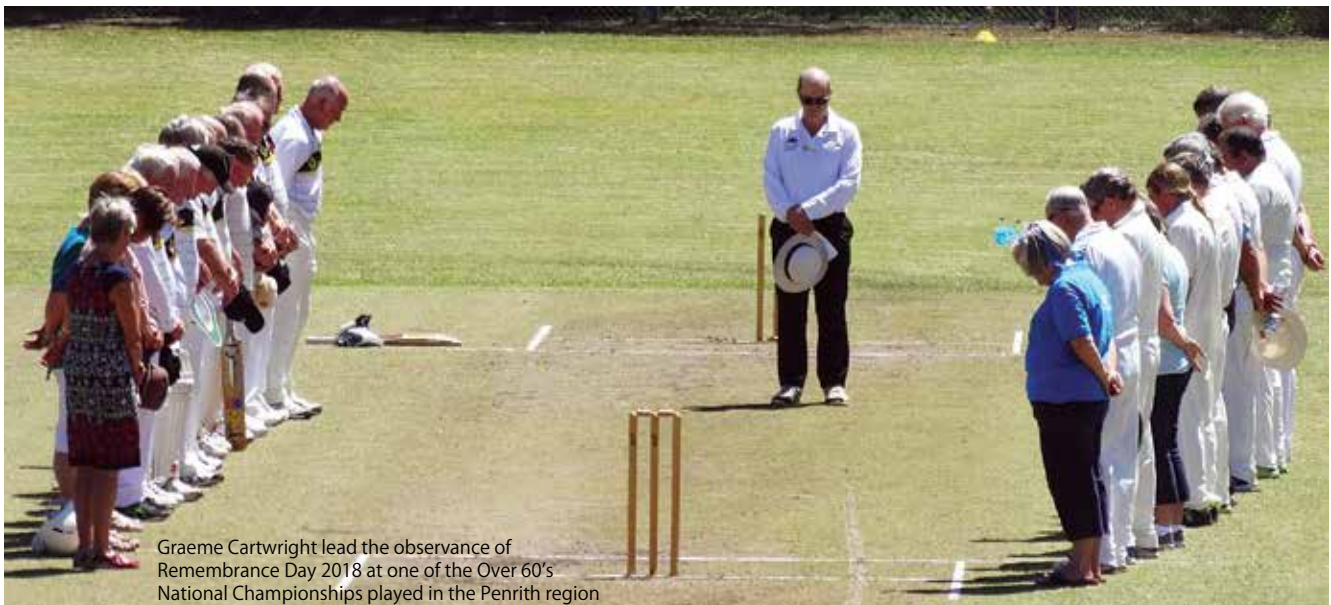

## Our SSCUA Treasurer

The financial year commenced on 1st May 2018 with a balance that had been reduced by a net amount of around \$700 from the previous season in 2017–18. As such our goal for 2018–19 was to ensure that our end of year balance did not go backwards for a second year in a row.

It is pleasing to report that we achieved this goal without any great concern. In fact it is pleasing to report that the final balance in the bank as at 30 April 2019 increased by 44%. This is a great effort for the Association moving forward.

This substantial increase is primarily due to the higher than expected sale of the Cricket Australia Toyota sponsored raffle tickets and the increase in membership levies due to a significant increase in the number of members which rose from 109 to 120 for the season just completed. Special mention to Dennis Oppenheim who made an outstanding contribution by selling nine raffle books raising the Association an additional \$450. Thank you Dennis - the Association greatly appreciates your contribution.

As a result the Association is in a very healthy and secure financial position. The handsome balance to be carried forward to the next financial year will comfortably meet initial expenditures pending the payment of members' registration fees.

We are once again grateful to the Sydney Cricket Association in continuing to support the SSCUA. The Association wishes to thank Roy Formica and Bruce Whitehouse at the SCA for their efforts in securing much needed funding for our Association in the form of an annual grant currently standing at \$3,955.00. More good news. Post season the Association was notified that its application for two grants under the NSW Government sports Program in the total sum of \$4,675.00 was successful. The committee has determined that the grant monies will be used to subsidise membership fees and free issue new caps and personalised notebooks. Many thanks are extended to Stephen Blomfield for successfully preparing and submitting the applications for these state government grants.

The committee approved the purchase of the Association pens distributed to

all members at the February meeting as well as the partial funding of the new polo field shirts. It also approved funding of beverages and door prizes for members attending Association meetings. Continuing from previous years the committee approved the necessary funds to cover the cost of producing the quality gloss presentation of the SSCUA's annual report and

seasonal handbook.

The Association continues to provide secretarial services and appointment of umpires for the Masters and Classics cricket competitions. This season the Association provided secretarial services for the inaugural Vintage (over 60 years

of age) competition. The Association also provided secretarial services and appointment of umpires for the Tim Creer Cup competition but unlike the others no levies were received for this service.

These additional secretarial services have yet again further increased the workload of the Honorary Secretary. For this reason the committee will be recommending an increase in the honorarium to the Honorary Secretary. The committee will also be recommending an increase in the honorariums for the compiler of the Association's annual report and the SSCUA handbook; and for the operator of the Association's website.

I wish to take this opportunity to extend my immense thanks to Stephen Blomfield for his superb and meticulous secretarial services during this and past seasons. The Association is fortunate to have this remarkable and diligent person in the role of Honorary Secretary.

Warwick is another new member who has a wealth of experience umpiring in a range of other

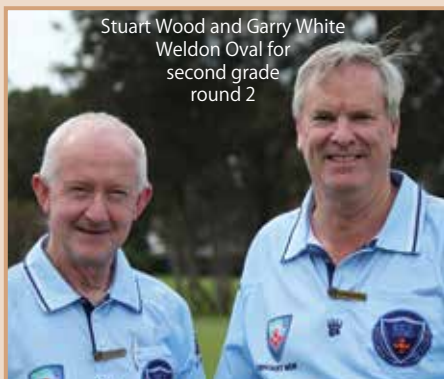
competitions over the years. He had umpired a lot in the Sydney women's competitions as well as having stood in over 80 matches in Premier Cricket.

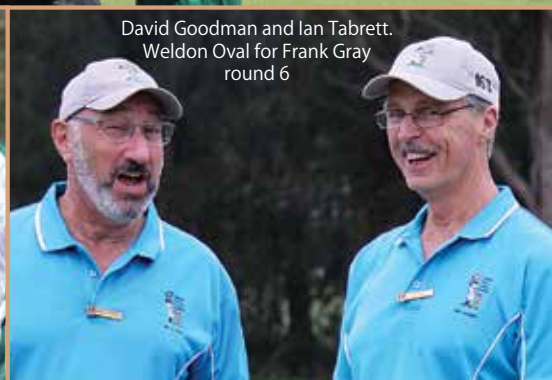

# First Grade Grand Final

THE R.B. CLARK CUP



The 2018–19 season decider saw Minor Premiers and two-time defending champions Mt Pritchard-Southern Districts taking on third placed Warringah, at Joe McAleer Reserve, Glendenning.

Mt Pritchard-Southern Districts progressed to their third straight Grand Final after a comfortable win against Burwood Briars in their semi-final match-up.

Warringah had a hard-fought away victory against Auburn to make their first Grand Final since the 2013–14 decider. In the round match, Mounties scored a comfortable 7 wicket win in the season's first round of one-day games.

Unfortunately, for the second time in three seasons, no play was possible on day one due to heavy overnight rain where 55mm fell in a matter of hours.

Fortunately for Simon, the only damage was wet clothing and some good natured banter from the players.

Arriving early on day two there were some good signs. Both teams were on the field commencing their warm-ups, the stumps were in, and the groundsman was mowing the table. A quick inspection of the previously water-logged outfield revealed that all the water had disappeared and the ground was in perfect condition. Play was going to commence on-time at 10am with a minimum of 106 overs to be bowled.



The all-important coin toss was won by Mounties captain Daniel Scheinflug, who surprisingly sent Warringah into bat, thereby forcing Warringah, as the lowest placed team, to take the game to Mounties. Warringah signalled their intention early by sending out regular lower order batsman Craig Rupert to





open with Hamish Ferguson. Ferguson started cautiously but Rupert began playing shots from the first over. An opening partnership of 41 was broken when two time Peter Toohey medallist, Adam Coyte, had Ferguson trapped LBW. Coyte had his second a short time later when Rupert, who made 34 off 37 balls, edged to Brenton Wright at first slip who took the catch low down. Warringah captain Tristan Rajah then joined number three batsman and overseas player Khalid Sawas, and with both playing some wonderful shots, they each reached 50 whilst maintaining a run rate of almost five an over. Shortly before lunch Rajah missed a turning delivery from Brenton Wright and was stumped for 50 ending a partnership of 135. Warringah went to lunch without the fall of another wicket with the score 3/190 after 39 overs.



Much lunch-time discussion was had about an impending declaration, with many getting it wrong, when Warringah continued their innings with Sawas closing in on a Grand Final ton. Quick runs were on the menu which in turn resulted in a number of quick wickets falling, including Sawas who was caught in the deep for a magnificent 94 of 100 balls. Warringah finally closed their innings 6 declared for 208 leaving 59 overs for them to bowl out Mounties to claim the R B Clark Trophy.

The equation for Mounties was a little simpler, either score 209 runs or bat the 59 overs. Openers Damien Duroux and Josh Blake showed their hand early by playing cautiously and not taking any risks despite Warringah's aggressive field placings and chat.

When Duroux played on a delivery from Glyn Archer, Mounties were 1/17 but 11 overs had been bowled. Adam Coyte joined Blake and began playing shots by hitting over the infield. When he edged behind for 10, Mounties were under pressure at 2/35.

Two more quick wickets had Mounties looking in trouble at 5/90 with plenty of overs still left. Brenton Wright then joined the solid Blake and set about chipping away at the total and the overs. When Wright slashed at a hip high full toss from the ageless Gareth Newman and was caught at gully by Rupert he had scored 23 but more importantly had eaten up 66 deliveries. Mounties 6/137 with 10 overs to go.

The following over by Ned Healey changed the match again and placed it firmly in Warringah's favour, taking two wickets in two balls, to have Mounties 8/138 with 9 overs still to bowl.

From then on for Mounties it was all about survival. Blake was joined by Number 10 batsman, Jagmeet Singh. Together they defended stoutly with some flashes of aggression from Singh who, early in his innings, hit a massive 6 over mid wicket.



Warringah rung the bowling changes, looking for a breakthrough, but unfortunately for them it was not to be. Singh finished 22 not out, all scored from boundaries, and the unflappable Blake finished 54 not out off 162 balls, saving the match for his side and ensuring Mounties went back to back to back winning the RB Clark Cup for the third season in a row.

The weather was not particularly kind for a Grand Final weekend. The first wicket fell in the 11th over with 25 runs on the board. Steady batting and bowling then became the order of the day up until the introduction of

bowler Matt Roper for the 23rd over with the score at 51 for the loss of two wickets. Roper then saw Burwood take the ascendancy with a damaging spell that saw him take four wickets in his opening six overs. From a solid position Auburn had faltered, going from 1/25 to 6/71 at the end of the 33rd over, placing Burwood in a strong position to overcome the disadvantage imposed as a consequence of their lower ranking on the competition table.

Steady recovery mode batting from Auburn saw a prolonged period without a further wicket. Then Auburn number seven Hamid Mangal decided to take the game by the scruff of the neck, procuring advantage of a short boundary on one side of the oval, and hit a regular number of sixes over that short boundary when the Burwood bowlers dropped short. During this period Mangal got good support from the middle order with Najeib Azzimi scoring 13, falling

Auburn were inspired with the early wicket of Mathew Roper in the fourth over. Star batsman Hamid Mangal taking the wicket. He would go on to take 3/46, clearly carrying an injury for the latter part of his 16 overs.

Kale Barton came to the crease at the fall of the first wicket with just one thing on his mind, bat as long as possible and keep the scoreboard ticking over. This he did, scoring 70 runs with just 4 boundaries.

At the fall of Barton's wicket, in the 51st over, Burwood were in the somewhat precarious position of being 6/161, still 86 runs short of the target. At this

Another two wickets were to fall quickly and by the 59th over Burwood seemed in trouble at 8/183. The short boundary and tight score line was proving to be too much of a risk for the Auburn skipper who elected to favour the success of his pace bowlers over spin.

Bastow and Sam Tregear took the score slowly and surely from 183 along to 223 and it looked like they would get there without any hiccups - but that was not to be. A silly run out saw Tregear well short of his crease and with one wicket in hand Burwood still needed 14. Auburn were now rampant and unrelenting. Appeals were many as the atmosphere from both the field of play and the pavilion intensified.

The crucial incident in the match occurred with the scores level. Number

John Biviano, Chairman of The Shires Cricket Committee, presented the trophy to Declan Kennedy, the Burwood Captain. The man of the match medal was presented to Burwood's Brett Bastow for a match defining 64 not out.
